## Graduate Interns at Lake Shore this Summer

This week Kelly Baker begins her second semester of her M.S.W. internship placement at Lake Shore through Baylor's Center for Family and Community Ministries (CFCM). Her main interests are youth and hunger/poverty issues.

The Piper Foundation has given the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship a \$1.5 million grant and the CFCM a \$1.1 million grant, both centered around the idea of transforming churches into "missional congregations." Because Kelly is doing her internship here, Lake Shore will receive \$10,000 in grant money

by the end of May. This week we are defining Kelly's role this summer (it will likely include Bread for the World, poverty-hunger education and missions for youth/adults, and participating in a church census with Baylor's MSW program).

Her role will be to help Lake Shore define its ministries and direct us into mission projects we can sustain in the times between social workers. This also moves us in the direction of eligibility for more grants through CBF. Sharlande is Kelly's on-site supervisor.

### Charles Conkin



Charles Conkin is a second year Truett Seminary student with a concentration in student ministry. He joined Lake Shore last year and will intern here this summer with Mike as his on-site supervisor. As his inaugural youth trip with Lake Shore, Charles went on the youth spring retreat to Three Mountain Retreat Center last weekend.

This summer Charles will focus on youth culture, parental involvement in youth faith formation, and youth ministry as an integral aspect of congregational life. He is looking forward to spending time with the youth and being a sponsor at Passport New Orleans this summer. About mentoring at Lake Shore, Charles says, "I believe Lake Shore Baptist Church is an inclusive community that offers the love of God to all people as I have seen throughout the youth ministry."

Charles was born in Louisville, Kentucky. His family moved to Georgia during his high school years. He graduated from high school there and attended Brewton-Parker College in Mt. Vernon, Georgia, where he majored in Christian studies. This summer, Charles will marry Michelle Stokes whom he met in college. She will teach special education at Mountainview this fall.

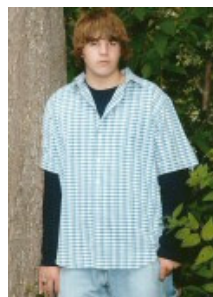
### **Thomas Miller, Waco High School**

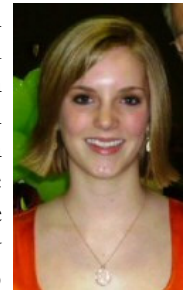
part of Lake Shore since he was in Kindergarten and was active in Helping Hands, Bridge Builders, and the youth group.

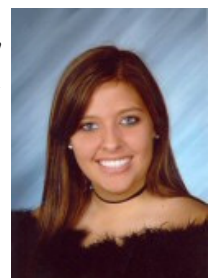


### **Haley Warren, Midway High School**
