Ministry Focus: Prayer Shawl Ministry



The Lakeshore Prayer Shawl Ministry began about one year ago with a vision for providing tangible evidence of God's love. We each work on our own to make a shawl or blanket for someone who needs healing. The healing may be physical, emotional, or spiritual. Then, led by Judy Prather and Patty Fields, we meet monthly and our group prays over each shawl or blanket and for the person who will receive it.

We have a truly intergenerational group with our youngest member being fourteen and our oldest enjoying the golden years. Those who have received our creations have expressed that they have felt blessed by these gifts and we can attest that we are blessed in the making of them. You may join us by praying, by letting us know of someone who may need a shawl, by contributing money for yarn, or by volunteering to make a shawl or blanket. Since participating in the Prayer Shawl ministry this year, April and I have been called to expand in a new direction.

“Someone was thinking of me.” This was the thought that stayed with me when I was in foster care and someone made me a quilt. I was moving from place to place before my parents adopted me three years ago. The person who made the quilt was a stranger, but they showed kindness to me through their stitches.

Because we want to surround other kids with this kind of love, my mom and I are starting a ministry called Kidz Komfort. We are attached to Lake Shore's prayer shawl ministry, but we will crochet or knit blankets for kids in foster care who are over 10 years old.

These kids have had many bad experiences—they don't just get into foster care because they feel like it. They end up in foster care because their family abused them, or neglected them, or were too young to take good care of them. At night, when they are in a strange place, kids can pull the blanket close to them and know “someone was thinking of me.” It lights a spark of hope in the kid's heart.

We will pray over each blanket and pray for each kid. God stitches our lives together, putting us together like a crocheted blanket. You still have mess ups, some holes are bigger than others. We are not perfect. But the blanket can still be useful and keep you warm.

Also, some kids don't like to be hugged by people, but they enjoy being cuddled by a blanket. I felt that way sometimes; I didn't want to hug or be close to a person because I knew I'd just have to leave them in a few weeks or, at the most, a couple of months. But being hugged by a blanket is like being surrounded by God's love for you. You always have it.
